Thank goodness that I can fast forward a few decades and say that some semblance of wisdom does come with age. Perhaps it's because we've had enough life experience to teach us that things will somehow work out. There is always hope even in times of uncertainty. We've learned that fretting about the unknown serves no real purpose. Most importantly, there is great freedom in understanding and embracing that the soundtrack of our lives is still a work in progress being written by a composer much greater and wiser than ourselves.

When I said yes to serving on the West Virginia State Board, I quipped to our kids and my sweet husband that I had no idea what I was getting myself into. Our youngest daughter Amanda, who is also a P.E.O., simply smiled and said, "Well, Mom, look at it

this way. Everything will be a wonderful surprise!" I think of Amanda's sunshiny response often. It's easy to dismiss that optimism considering the challenges, disappointments, and discord of the world around us. But I encourage each of us to not let a fear of the unknown cloud the hope of wonderful things to come. How empowering to step out in faith with the optimism that life might bring wonderful surprises and unexpected blessings. 152 years ago, seven young women stepped out in faith with open hearts and in doing so they discovered beautiful new voices, bringing beautiful new harmonies to the soundtrack of P.E.O.

We have no idea what the future will hold, but we know that our sisterhood is *resilient*. When we gather "virtually" for our Convention of International Chapter we will again step out in faith just as our founders did. We have no idea what blessings and "wonderful surprises" lie ahead. But we will celebrate the Harmony of our Hearts because the main theme, the beautiful melody that weaves through the soundtrack of our sisterhood has not changed. The bonds of sisterhood bring the harmony to our hearts as we provide educational opportunities for women. And that, dear sisters, is humbling and fills my musical heart with joy.
